## **CRIMINAL JUSTICE (BS)**

By teaching the fundamentals of criminal justice and critical and creative thinking skills, the Criminal Justice program is designed to endow students with the fundamental knowledge to move on to a four-year institution of higher learning or enter careers in one of the major components of the American or Tribal criminal justice systems – law enforcement, the courts, or corrections – or allied fields.

- 1. The student will critically assess theories of criminology, methods, or investigative techniques to analyze patterns of crimes and establish criminal intent and victimology.
- 2. The student will demonstrate an understanding of tribal, state, and federal jurisdictions.
- 3. The student will execute written materials at a level befitting government reporting.
- 4. The student will display the professional and ethical conduct expected in courtrooms and in criminal justice fieldwork.
